- Read the poem aloud or ask a pupil to do so.
- In groups, children discuss why the poet has written this poem and why people's years might be different shapes.
- Share ideas as a whole class
- Model your own year either through a drawing or a poem or a story
- In groups, children discuss how they think the year ahead is likely to look.
- Children represent the shape of the coming year in any format they wish.
- Finish with a 'classroom walk' where children leave their representation on their desk and walk around looking at others and chatting about the different ideas.
